# **Advice following a Flexible Cystoscopy/ Stent removal**

You may experience some discomfort when passing urine for a couple of days following your procedure. This is normal however if the discomfort carries on or becomes worse, contact your family doctor for further advice.

There is a risk of bleeding and infection following this procedure, you are advised to increase your fluid intake by 3 – 4 glasses of water for the next couple of days. If you feel you are developing an infection please provide a urine sample to your family doctor for it to be tested as it may not be an infection but symptoms from the procedure.

You can return to work as normal the same day

If you have any questions please do not hesitate to ask the Nurse or Doctor that is looking after you
